GUIDELINES WINDEYER FELLOWSHIP

Radiation Oncology For trainees post-Phase two examinations or Fellows no more than two years post-Fellowship

The RANZCR Terms and Conditions – Grants and Fellowships must be read in conjunction with these guidelines.

PURPOSE

This is a Fellowship position that provides a candidate with clinical research opportunities alongside clinical experience in several subspecialty sites at the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre, Northwood, in the United Kingdom. The position is under the broad supervision of Professor Peter Hoskin. There may also be an opportunity to spend time at other UK centres including the Christie Hospital, Manchester, and University College London Hospitals (UCLH), where experience in subspecialty interests such as proton therapy, MR linac treatment and paediatric oncology can be provided.

THE AWARD

The applicant will be paid a salary equivalent to that of a Senior Registrar by Mount Vernon Cancer Centre.

TENURE

The position is for 12 months.

ELIGIBILITY

- Trainees post-Phase two examinations or a Fellow of the RANZCR (no more than two years post-Fellowship)
- Residing in Australia, New Zealand or Singapore at time of application, appointment and commencement of the Fellowship
- A graduate of a University in Australia, New Zealand or other Medical School approved by the Faculty Council.

CONDITIONS FOR APPOINTMENT

- The applicant must be prepared to fund all travel, living and relocation expenses.
- The applicant must be prepared to take up the position by the end of January in the relevant year.
- It is also expected that within two years of assuming the position, the applicant will return and engage in the practice of radiation oncology in Australia, New Zealand or Singapore for at least two years.
- The successful applicant shall provide a report to the Education and Training Committee within three months of completing the tenure of the position.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- The applicant will be required to submit a letter to the Dean outlining their interest and qualifications for this job position (maximum 400 words), accompanied by a current curriculum vitae and a completed application form.
- Applicants must demonstrate how the position will benefit their intended career.
- The applicant must specify the year for which they are applying.
- Applications will be accepted up to 18 months in advance of the recipient taking up the position.
- Applications will be reviewed as received.

The application form can be downloaded from the <u>College website</u>. Applications should be submitted along with relevant supporting documentation. Late applications will not be accepted.

APPLICATION ENDORSEMENT

The Dean and the Chief Censor will review and rank the applications on behalf of the Radiation Oncology Training and Education Committee.

NOTIFICATION

Once a successful recipient has been determined, further to endorsement by Faculty Council, the College will formally notify the successful candidate by email.

ANNOUNCEMENT

Once the position has been filled for that year, it will be announced on the College website. The recipient will be added to the College Awards and Honours Roll, which is published on the College website.

Please note awards and grants are subject to change on an annual basis.
