



GUIDELINES INDIGENOUS HEALTH RESEARCH PRIZE

Radiation Oncology

For Fellows, Educational Affiliates and eligible trainees

The RANZCR Terms and Conditions must be read in conjunction with these guidelines.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Indigenous Health Research Prize is to promote research and publication to increase awareness and understanding of Indigenous Health issues in cancer care. The prize will only be awarded in the case of high-quality research in Indigenous Health being published in a peer-reviewed journal.

BACKGROUND

The RANZCR Research Strategy Plan 2017-2020 acknowledges that the safe and effective practice of modern medicine draws ever increasingly on the outputs of health and medical research and a commitment to evidence-based clinical decision making. The College is committed to promoting and facilitating a research culture and recognition of research performance.

PRIZE

One prize of AU\$2,000. Funds will be paid directly to the prize recipient following confirmation by the Faculty of Radiation Oncology Council and endorsement of the Board. The recipient will be recognised at the RANZCR ASM.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants will be:

- Financial members of the College
- A Fellow, Educational Affiliate or trainee of the RANZCR
- The first author of the research publication.

Applicants must provide a manuscript of a research paper that has been accepted for publication or has been published by the closing date for the application. For 2020-2021, this will be accepted from the preceding two years. From 2022, this will be accepted from the preceding 12 months.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Any eligible member of the College may apply for this prize by completing the application form, which can be downloaded from the [College website](#).

Application forms should be submitted along with relevant supporting documentation. Late applications will not be accepted.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

A panel of reviewers will be established by the FRO Radiation Oncology Research Committee (RORC) of RANZCR to assess and rank the applications. Expert outside reviewers, including members of the Māori, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Executive Committee (MATEC), with particular relevant specialist knowledge may be co-opted by the RORC to contribute to the process.

Any conflict of interest among the panel of reviewers will be declared by individuals, duly recorded and may exclude the panel member from being involved in the assessment process.

The following criteria are used in judging the application

These will include:

1. Potential impact and importance of the manuscript

2. Cultural sensitivity
3. Originality
4. Soundness of general method
5. Soundness of statistical methods
6. Style and clarity
7. Quality of illustrations, tables, etc.
8. Grammar, spelling, syntax
9. Degree of work involved
10. Scope of discussion
11. Validity of conclusion

CRITERIA FOR WITHDRAWING PRIZE

False or misleading information provided during the application process which comes to light subsequently.

NOTIFICATION

Once a successful recipient has been endorsed by the Faculty Council, the College will formally notify the successful recipient by email. Ordinarily this notification will take place by the end of July each year.

PRESENTATION AND ANNOUNCEMENT

The award recipient will be invited to attend the College's Annual Ceremony at the Annual Scientific Meeting, to be held at the Melbourne Exhibition and Convention Centre between 15 and 18 October 2020, where they will be presented with their prize.

Following the Annual Ceremony, the recipient will be added to the College Awards and Honours Roll, which is published on the College website, and sponsors of the prize will be informed of the recipients where relevant.

Please Note: Awards and Grants are subject to change on an annual basis.
