



GUIDELINES ROUSE TRAVELLING FELLOWSHIP

*For Fellows (5 years+ post Fellowship at close of application in Clinical Radiology
and Radiation Oncology)*

The College Terms and Conditions for Grants and Fellowships must be read in conjunction with these guidelines.

PURPOSE

The Rouse Travelling Fellowship is established as a vehicle for the continuing exchange of information and ideas between clinical radiologists and radiation oncologists of Australia and New Zealand and honours the memory of the late Edgar Rouse, an early College benefactor.

The Fellowship enables a Fellow from Australia or New Zealand to attend and present at the College's annual scientific meeting in the other country, and to visit and present in their field of interest in at least three training centres in that country.

THE AWARD

The monetary value of the Fellowship will be AU\$8,000, subject to annual review by Board of Directors.

If the Annual Scientific Meeting of the College is to be held in the host country, it is essential that the Fellow attend the meeting within the period of his/her Fellowship. Failing this, an Australian Fellow should visit New Zealand at the time of the Annual Meeting of that Branch.

The Fellow preferably should visit a department related to his/her field(s) of interest in each of three centres in the host country. In the case of a Fellow from New Zealand, these centres are to be in different Australian Branches.

TENURE

Each Fellowship will be of three weeks' duration.

ELIGIBILITY


A Fellow is appointed annually from New Zealand and Australia alternately. A ratio of three Clinical Radiology Fellows to one Radiation Oncology Fellow is maintained.

In 2019, a Clinical Radiology Fellow from Australia is sought to travel to New Zealand to attend the Annual Scientific Meeting from 17-20 October 2019.

1. The recipient must be:
 - A Fellow of the RANZCR (5 years+ post Fellowship at close of application)
 - A graduate of a University in Australia, New Zealand or other Medical School approved by the Faculty Council
 - A citizen of Australia and New Zealand
 - Residing in Australia and New Zealand at time of application
 - Residing in Australia and New Zealand at the time of appointment and commencement of the Fellowship
2. The Rouse Travelling Fellow must be an active, experienced consultant of at least intermediate status.

CRITERIA FOR APPOINTMENT

- The applicant must be of good standing within the College, being compliant with all College policies (for example, a financial member, CPD compliant).
- The applicant must nominate their field of interest and demonstrate their ability to present their knowledge in that field (e.g. list of published papers, other talks).
- The applicant must provide a proposed schedule and topic although this may be amended following appointment subject to discussions with regional representatives.



- The applicant must provide support from two referees who will attest to the benefit of their proposed itinerary.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Any eligible member of the College may apply for this Fellowship by completing the application form, which can be downloaded from the College website. Application forms should be submitted to the College, along with relevant supporting documentation.

The closing date for applications will be promoted through various College communication channels, including e-newsletters, the College website and Inside News, and shall be in or around April of each year.

Late applications will not be accepted.

APPLICATION ENDORSEMENT

If Australia is the sponsoring county, applications will be sought from the members. Received applications will be reviewed by the relevant educational and training committee. The Chief Censor will make a recommendation to the relevant Faculty Council for endorsement.

For a New Zealand Fellow visiting Australia, applications will be shortlisted by the New Zealand Branch, in consultation with its Branch Educational Officer. The shortlisted application will be reviewed by the relevant education and training committee. The Chief Censor will then make a recommendation to the relevant Faculty Council for endorsement.

NOTIFICATION

Once a successful recipient has been determined, further to endorsement by the relevant Faculty Council, the College will formally notify the successful recipient by email. Ordinarily this notification will take place by the end of July each year.

PRESENTATION AND ANNOUNCEMENT

The Rouse Travelling Fellowship recipient will be invited to attend the College's Annual Ceremony at the Annual Scientific Meeting, where they will be presented with their award.

Following the Annual Ceremony, the recipient will be added to the College Award and Honour Roll, which is published on the College website, and funders of the honours will be informed of the recipients, where relevant.

Please Note: Awards and Grants are subject to change on an annual basis.
